III. THEORETICAL BACKGROUND

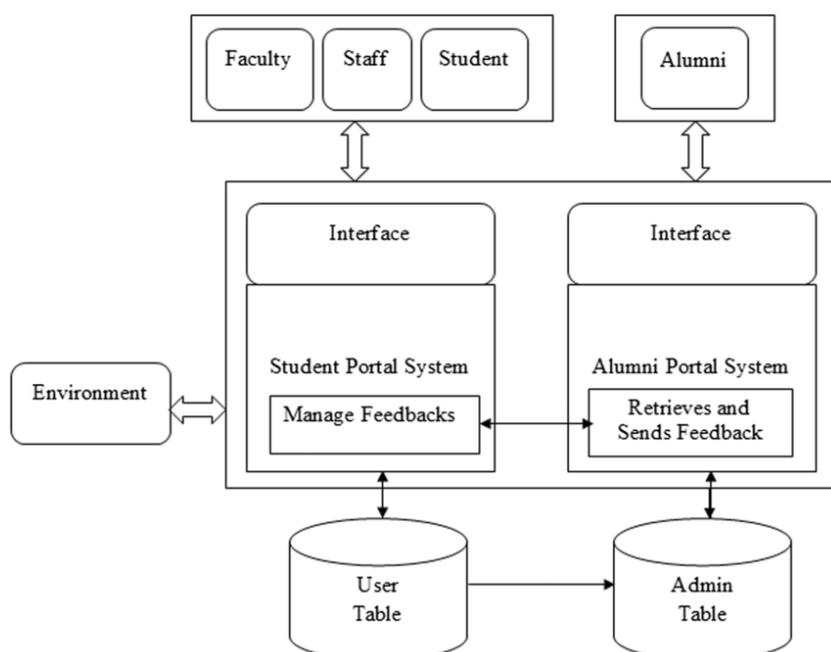
3.1 PROBLEM IDENTIFICATION
